Infectious Diseases Society of New York Infectious Disease Fellows Abstract Submissions - 2020

To recognize IDSNY adult and pediatric ID fellows' research accomplishments, we will again have a fellow scientific research competition and award as part of the annual symposium of the NY Infectious Disease society.

Submission requirements:

- 1. First author must be a current pediatric or adult ID fellow in the New York Metropolitan area.
- Fellows must be members of the IDSNY which is <u>free</u> (http://www.idsny.org).
 Fellows must be able to present their posters and, if selected for an award, give a PowerPoint presentation on the day of the meeting Tuesday, May 19th, 2020, at the Lubin Building of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine 1300 Morris Park Avenue Bronx NY 10461.
- 3. Fellows may submit <u>any abstract</u> regardless of prior or intended future regional or national presentations.
- 4. Research must have been performed within the prior year.
- 5. **No case presentations** are accepted unless part of a broader research study.

Abstract selection for presentation and criteria for cash award:

- 1. There will be two award categories: clinical and basic (bench, incl. translational) research.
- 2. A committee made up of board members of the IDSNY will review the abstracts based on scientific merit.
- 3. Winners of the competition will receive an award and a cash prize at the meeting; they are also anticipated to present their data in power point (in addition to the poster).
- 4. Please note that all accepted abstracts are anticipated to be presented in form of a poster regardless of award. We ask you to remain close to your poster during lunch and coffee break of the meeting (poster boards are 4' x 6' and accommodate regular poster sizes).

Abstracts must adhere to the format requirements outlined below.

- 1. The entire contents of the abstract, including title, authors, and institutional affiliations must fit on a **single 8½ by 11-inch sheet** when printed.
- 2. Abstracts should be submitted as a **Word document**.
- 3. Arial 11-point typeface, all in black, with single spaced text with margins of one inch.
- 4. The heading should be a short, concise title in bold font, followed by all authors' first and last names, degrees, and institutions.
- 5. Word limit of 350 for abstract text (without title, authors and affiliations) plus one optional table, figure, or photo.
- 6. The structure should include objectives, methods, results, and conclusions. Fonts in tables and figures should be easily readable when printed on a letter size page. Photographs should be in black and white.
- 7. Generic names should be used for therapeutic agents.
- 8. All non-standard or unusual abbreviations must be defined in parentheses after the first use of the abbreviation.
- 9. An e-mail address and if applicable, all sources of funding must be included. If necessary, these may be as small as 9 point and appear in the bottom margin, although they still must be black.

Abstracts should be sent as a Word document via e-mail by **April 6th**, **2020** to the IDSNY President-elect Adam Ratner, MD, MPH at <u>Adam.Ratner@nyulangone.org</u>. Receipt of submissions will be confirmed by email.
